With regard to the results of other examinations except the final session / year of Summer Examination 2020.

S.No : Sampavamum / 2020-21 / 1, dated 18th May, 2020, Director / Head of various academic departments of the University, Principals of affiliated / operated colleges, Director / Head of recognized institutes, Director of distance and open study institutes, Coordinator and Assistant Registrar of Ratnagiri and Thane sub-campuses of the University

The Board of Examinations and Assessment, University of Mumbai has issued an online notification on 21/05/2020 regarding the processing of results of other examinations except the final session / year of Summer Examination 2020 through this circular.

As per the decision taken in the meeting, 50% internal marks and 50% marks of the previous odd session (1, 3, 57) of the same year without taking the examination of the students except the final year of the same session (sessions 2, 4, 68) entered in the academic year 2019-20. The procedure for adjudication is as follows:

- 1) Regular students in sessions 2, 4, 6 etc. If there are any internal marks examinations, they should be completed online, by submitting a short dissertation, by taking an oral examination by telephone or by asking for a presentation, continuous assessment etc.
- 2) The marks of all the subjects of the student should be taken into account to get the average marks of the previous session. In this, the marks of all subjects (Theory, Practical, Oral, Term work) should be taken and converted into 50 marks accordingly. This includes a subject in an odd session exam. If the arithmetic of the revaluation has changed, the revaluation marks should be taken into account.

3) Academic year in a course which does not have a system of internal marks for the course examinations

Marks of the subjects in the odd session of the students admitted in the year 2019-20 to the subjects in the odd session

Should be given. E.g. Session-5 marks for Session-2, Session-3 marks for Session-4, etc. Odd in it

The subject marks of the session should be given to any subject in the same session, for which-

F.Y. And Form 1 for SYBA.

F.Y. And Form-2 for SYBcom,

F.Y. And S.Y.B.Sc. Form-3 should be reviewed.

(In front of the subject in column A of the form, the marks of the subject shown in column and mine should be given.)

If the internal marks in the foundation course are available in the same session, then they are in the same session

External marks out of 75 should be taken from the previous session (odd). If the internal 25 marks are not available in the same session, they should also be taken from the previous session (odd).

4) Three-year LL.B. The second year of this LL.B. And five-year B.L.S. Second in,

For the results of 3rd and 4th year (students admitted in the academic year 2019-20) the average marks of the subjects of the odd session of that year are taken out and the marks are given to all the subjects of the even session.

E.g. Average of Session-1 (October, 2019 exams) marks for Session-2 examination

4) The syllabus of the course for which the internal marks system will be followed is as follows

Use only for students admitted in 2019-20.

Option-1: Courses which will have 25 marks in Internal Examination and 75 marks in External

Examination: Session-1

E.g. The marks in the previous examination (October 2019) will be as shown in the table below.

The total marks of the above subjects are 327 and the marks of this subject are out of 500. When these marks are converted into 100 marks, they come to 65 (after converting to integers), so 33 marks out of 50 (after converting to integers) should be considered for giving 50% marks for the next session.

The internal marks out of 25 in the table above are the internal marks in Session-2. While preparing the marks out of 75, the internal marks of 25 out of 25 and 50% marks of the previous session have been taken and the sum of the marks of internal and external (25 + 75) has been shown out of 100 marks.

And marks and 50% from previous session The marks are made up of 35 marks and the sum of the marks of internal and external (20 + 80) is shown out of the total marks out of 100 (for 50% internal marks the internal marks out of 20 are in the external examination. 30 have been done.)

Option-3: Course which will have 40 marks in Internal Examination and 60 marks in External Examination.

The internal marks out of 30 in the table above are the internal marks in session-2. 30 out of 70 marks Of these, it is in session-2. 20 marks are converted and 50% marks are obtained by taking 30 marks from the previous session and the sum of the marks of internal and external (30 + 70) marks are shown out of the total marks of 100 marks. The score is 20 in the external exam Have been quantified.)

Option-5: Course which will have 60 marks in Internal Examination and 40 marks in External Examination.

The total marks of the above subjects are 372 and the marks of this subject are out of 500. When these marks are converted to 100 marks, they come to 74 (after converting to integer), so to give 40% marks for the next session, 30 marks out of 40 (after converting to integer) should be considered. Because basically in this pattern 60% internal marks system.

The internal marks out of 60 in the table above are the internal marks in session-2 But 50% marks in internal examination

Since it is to be accepted, the marks obtained out of 60 are converted into the marks obtained out of 50 and are shown in column 10. But since 60 marks are to be given internally, the average of the previous session is 30 out of 40 marks. If you convert 30 marks out of 10 marks, you get 8 marks. The marks are shown in the column "10" to get the marks in the internal marks. Sum of points Total marks Shown out of 100.)

- ε) While preparing the result of the same session as shown in the above option, according to the pattern of the examination, the marks should be prepared according to the number of subjects in the relevant course session. As per the rules of the university, using grace, ordinance etc., the results of the examination should be declared according to the grading system (7 Point / 10 Point) and marks should be given as per the prevailing system.
- ϑ) If the student fails some of the subjects of the same session using the above grading system, the examination will be conducted within 120 days after the commencement of the college / university ecology / university department.
Will come.
- ζ) While adopting the above method, if the student fails the subject of odd session in the courses which do not have internal marks examination in No.3, then the examination of the subject in the previous odd session will be conducted within 120 days after the commencement of college / university ecosystem / university department. The results of the session should be prepared. If a student fails the subject of both odd and even sessions, he / she will have to appear for the examination of the failed subjects at the time of the next session in October / November, 2020.
- Ϸ) Using this method in 50% internal and 50% previous exams, if a student has failed a subject in the previous exam in an odd session but has passed all the subjects in the same session according to 50% internal and 50% previous marks, the result of the same session should be declared. If the subject passes the examination within 120 days, the result of the same session should not be changed.
- 10) If the student wants to improve the grade after the results are declared using the above method of grading, the examination can be conducted within 120 days after the commencement of the college / university ecology / university department.
- 11) Using this method in 50% internal and 50% previous exams, the student failed some subjects in the same session and also in the examination which takes place within 120 days after the commencement of college / university ecology / university department, some subjects in the same session or odd session failed. Excluding) Such a student will have to appear for the examination of the subjects which failed in the examination of the next session in October / November, 2020.
- 12) Some colleges have conducted examinations in some subjects for the same session-2 and 4 in March, 2020. Those colleges should evaluate the answer sheets. Given the current situation, there is no need for moderation from an external examiner while evaluating the answer sheets. The marks obtained in this subject and 50% internal and 50% marks as per the previous session, whichever is higher, should be accepted by the student. Also, if the student wants to improve the grade of the result declared accordingly, he / she can also improve the examination which will be held within 520 days after the commencement of the college / university ecology / university department.

13) Some colleges have conducted examinations in some subjects of odd sessions-1 and 3 in March, 2020. Those colleges should evaluate the answer sheets. Given the current situation, there is no need for moderation from an external examiner while evaluating the answer sheets. If these examinations are completed, the results should be declared as per the rules of the university. If the examinations are incomplete, the examinations for the remaining subjects should be conducted within 120 days after the commencement of the college / university ecosystem / university department and the results should be declared thereafter.

14) The above procedure will be applicable only for the students who have submitted their examination applications for undergraduate and postgraduate courses for the summer 2020 examination only for the summer 2020 examination.

By using the above methods as required, the results of the examinations which are to be declared by the colleges as per the university rules should be declared by the colleges. Also, the results of the examinations which are being announced through the Examination Department, University of Mumbai, should be announced by the Examination Department, University of Mumbai.

The above information should be brought to the notice of all concerned.
