Dr. Anushree Lokur welcomed all the members and informed the external members about the revision of IQAC Committee for 2021-22.

Dr. Jessy Pius introduced all the members and started the meeting with the following deliberations.

The minutes of the 4th meeting held on 1st June 2021 had been circulated to the members. The minutes of the meeting was confirmed by Dr. Bhole and seconded by Mr. Nimkar

2.1 Reviewing the activities of IQAC for the academic year 2020-21

Action taken report of 2020-21 was mailed to all the members on 31st May 2020.

Agenda No. 3: To discuss the Plan of Action for the current Academic year (2021-22)

Areas that require special focus:

3.1 *Curricular Aspects*:

3.1.1 Quality education (SDG Goal 4)

3.1.1.1 Introducing CBCS in PG courses with Core and Elective papers

Jessy Pius shared that IQAC conducted two sessions in the last Academic year regarding introducing choice based credit system with core and electives in PG courses. In this academic year subject wise training will be conducted on the same and all PG departments will be preparing the choice based curriculum.

3.1.1.2 To explore interdisciplinary/ multidisciplinary approach in syllabus

Jessy Pius shared the suggestions received from faculty involving multidisciplinary areas like financial literacy, investment planning, IPR, soft skills ,life skills etc. Student representative Nikita suggested inclusion of Mental Health as a topic besides Nutrition and Diet in the Foundation Course paper. Dr. Lokur assured that Mental Health related topics are underway for First year UG and PG students.

Resolved that the Mental Health related topics will be included in Induction program/ Foundation Course Syllabus/ as a certificate course. Also IQAC will take feedback on Foundation Course syllabus and will try to bring in multidisciplinarity.

3.1.1.3 Diploma/ Certificate Course on Product Stewardship

Mr. Nimkar suggested that he will arrange a meeting with an Academician who has designed the syllabus for 'Diploma in Industrial Chemistry and Sustainable Technology', in which Product Stewardship is one of the topics. This course can be conducted after Masters either in the form of 1 year Course or 2 years Course.

Resolved that the Dean Academics will take the matter further.

3.1.1.4 Apprenticeship embedded courses

Dr. Jaison brought forth the need to partner with industry for hands-on training. Dr. Bhole suggested that a 3-week training can be conducted in the institution from industry people on Regulatory Affairs as per the BIS standards which can be called as Certificate Courses because classical apprenticeship may not be possible.

Dr. Lokur said that we can have such courses in Instrumentation, Health Care, Food Quality Control, etc

Mr. Godbole expressed his willingness to arrange meetings with the operators from Microsoft, Redhat, SAP for online courses. He also suggested that Job opportunities and courses could also be mapped in 4 districts of Konkan area, under Magnetic Maharashtra to increase campus employability.

Resolved that since classical apprenticeship may not be possible, we will have special discussion on this topic with Mr.Godbole

3.1.1.5 Inclusive and Equitable Learning for PWD (Persons with Disability).

Hardik, the student representative, suggested creating an audio library for visually challenged students and Dr. Bhole suggested that these learning resources can be made available on the E-bookshelf.

Ms Urmi Palan, the secretary of Ruia College Alumni Association(RCAA) said that RCAA can contribute financially as well as bring in resource persons for skilling in different areas which need to be defined. Some of them may be computer training (vocational), like making powerpoints, effective use of Excel, etc. Other areas need to be identified.

Resolved that areas of skill-developments will be finalised and communicated to RCA. Also Dr.Bhole's suggestion will be communicated to the librarian.

3.1.1.6 To explore 4 years degree course(interdisciplinary/ multidisciplinary/ in collaboration with other Institutes or foreign universities)

3.1.1.7 Initiating New Courses -

- PG course in Psychology
- Certificate course in Universal Human Values and Professional Ethics
- Certificate course in Yoga and Meditation

3.2 Teaching, Learning and Evaluation:

3.2.1To organise training for staff: training for innovations in Teaching pedagogy/ teaching- learning process (FDP/PDP)/ICT/MOOC/Team-building activities/ leadership programs / training programs

Dr. Jessy Pius shared the suggestions received from faculty especially regarding training teachers for developing MOOC courses. Dr.Bhole suggested having a benchmark for MOOC; making a list of courses to be made, shortlisting of courses that can be made over a period of 3 years, whether parallel courses or add-on courses.

Resolved that IQAC will be conducting training in MOOC for a group of 20 teachers and at least 5-6 MOOC courses will be developed in this academic year which will be uploaded on our LMS.

3.2.2 To develop a strategy for identify the Slow and Advanced learners

Dr. Bhole suggested a psychometric test supplemented with any formative assessment of first year students will help in identifying slow and advanced learners. Dr. Lokur added that this is done to strategize our teaching and to reach out to all the students.

Resolved that IQAC will contact the psychology department and develop a strategy for conducting intelligence test /psychometric test online/offline for the students of first year.

3.2.3 To enhance Alumni involvement in teaching

Ms. Urmi Palan said that she will put across this plan in RCAA. She also said that alumni can be involved in teaching, guiding and mentoring.

3.3. Research Innovation and Extension

- To encourage faculty to explore research funding agencies and collaboration
- To improve visibility of research and publications
- To conduct workshops on IPR
- To promote entrepreneurship as an alternative career
- To undertake various extension activities including SDG

Dean Research enlisted the activities that are planned: Writing research proposals for funding, Selecting good journals, Enhancing research visibility etc..

Dr. Lokur stated that sessions should be conducted under IPR on: Preparing patentable proposals, Patent-searching etc. Also Dr. Lokur added that our IPR policy is ready. It will be uploaded on the website once it's passed in the GB meeting.

Dr. Kamini inquired whether RCAA can provide seed money for newly joined faculty to take up small research projects.

Ms Urmi Palan put forth the student-requirement by some alumni for their projects, where students will be able to learn and may get co-authorship of a publication.

Resolved that IQAC will be conducting sessions in collaboration with the IPR committee. Ms. Urmi Palan will convey all the points to RCAA and will inform IQAC. IQAC will share the Academic Calendar of activities with RCAA in order to reach out to all students.

3.4 Learning Resources:

Ms. Veena Thakare, our Librarian shared the following activities that will be conducted by the Library

- To continue the monthly creation the genre specific virtual bookshelves
- To continue displaying the virtual bookshelves on Library page of the college website and monthly Ruiaite online
- To prepare each month subject-wise virtual shelves of open access journals that are indexed in WoS, with their latest impact factor (from January 2022 onwards)
- To display virtual OA journal-shelves on the Library page and monthly Ruiaite online
- To. continue the virtual display of each year's new arrivals in the Library's print collection.

3.5 Student support and progression

Dr.Jessy Pius shared the above mentioned suggestions received from faculty and from RCAA

Resolved that IQAC will conduct meetings with the Centre for innovation, incubation and Entrepreneurship development, Ruia Academy for Competitive exams and Placement cell regarding the above suggestions and will encourage them to conduct activities. Also IQAC will plan strategies to increase the number of registered Alumni and their involvement in college development.

Dr Bhole said rather than increasing the number of students in College committees each committee should record the suggestions given by all members and student representatives in their minutes of the meeting.

2.1 Introducing CBCS in PG courses with Core and Elective papers

Two sessions were conducted on CBCS. One on 5th January 2022 at 4.00pm by Dr. Saroj Gaskarbi of University of Pune for PG courses and second on 8th January 2022 at 11.00am by Dr. Pradnya Prabhu, Principal KJ Somaiya College for UG courses. All Departments were told to prepare the frame work for their subject both for UG and PG by 29th January 2022.

2.2. To explore interdisciplinary/ multidisciplinary approach in syllabus

RuiaCentre for Mindfulness & Wellbeing and IQAC in collaboration with 'Heartful Campus' conducted a 10days induction program for PG First year and a 6days induction program for First year UG students on Yoga & Breath Work, Lifeskills & Meta Skills, Interpersonal and Bonding, Universal Values and Meditation. Under CBCS this activity will be incorporated in curriculum as Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC).

IQAC also took feedback on Foundation Course syllabus, and based on the feedback received, some of the suggestions will be incorporated in AECC or in SEC(Skill Enhancement Course) to bring in multidisciplinarity.

2.3 To develop a strategy to identify the Slow and Advanced learners

IQAC contacted the psychology department and developed a strategy for conducting intelligence test /psychometric test offline for the students of first year as many teachers raised their concern in conducting it online. IQAC will be conducting it once the offline lectures start.

Dr. Ashwini Deshpande started the meeting with the following deliberations

Agenda. No. 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the first meeting of IQAC held on 4 th September 2021 at 3.00pm.

The minutes of the 1st meeting held on 4th September 2021 had been circulated to the members. Mr Nimkar proposed and Mrs Sanghamitra seconded the passing of the minutes.

Agenda No.2 Discussion on Action Taken Report

Report of the actions taken on the decisions taken in the 1st meeting of IQAC was presented to the Members which covered the following points

- Regarding the point on developing a strategy to identify slow and advanced learners, Mr Nimkar suggested some change in the nomenclature for slow learners.
- Research Dean explained the activities organised by Research cell and also the activities planned- short term and long term.
- In connection with the discussion on learning resources, Mr. Nimkar suggested that the Library can curate and make available events happening worldwide /global events (webinars) for students of Ruia College. also information from 10 top journals, curate them and make it available online. Mr. Nimkar also talked about virtual library club -Enlightened sapiens.
 - Principal Anushree Lokur suggested that "Make the Library an active centre of knowledge." Take initiatives to develop the reading habits of students.Initiate a book club and online discussion group.
 - Nikita- suggested names of Akshay Krishnan, and Akhil RaviKumar (Science) for the book club.
 - Varsha Malawde suggested that she along with Snehal Joshi, a student of BA, can help identify books, and faculty can spend an hour per month to discuss and share what they had read. One outside expert or a faculty from each department could be invited to share and discuss his/her top 10 books. Each department can dedicate one student who is a good reader to form a Library squad.
 - Dr. Kanchan added that students can be given assignments of Book Review and in timetable 1 hour per month as a library hour.
 - Mr. Nimkar also suggested that students may be given a token of appreciation for a good book review. He also suggested providing audio books for the visually challenged students. Varsha Malawde suggested that the above work can be done by the teachers and students voluntarily. External members and Alumni may also be involved in the process. Audio recording of books can be done and links can be provided to visually challenged students. The Librarian can take sessions in all classes regarding the library.
 - Mrs Sanghamitra asked whether the library has collaboration with other Institutes. She suggested initiating collaboration with Gokhale Institute and Bhandarkar institute. It only has to open the path to access the books.
 - Dr. Lokur asked the Librarian to take sessions from the subsequent month on general topics such as inculcating reading habits, and mentoring. The librarian was also asked to take opinion from Dr.Hate.
- Dr. Lokur asked to conduct more computer skilling workshops, in hybrid mode under SDG
- Dr. Sunil SD suggested making it a certificate course. He also suggested having a computer training course for Visually challenged students in collaboration with SDG and Self Vision Centre. Dr. Lokur supported by adding that these courses can be sponsored by college.

- Dr. Lokur said that Policy on Disposal of waste-Bio waste and Chemical waste for disposal is ongoing. College is also planning to install an effluent treatment plant.
- Mr. Nimkar agreed to give contact details of the agency for chemical-disposal.
- Dr. Sunil SD explained that TY Chemistry students, in collaboration with TY Botany students, did a project on chemical waste-water treatment using algae.

• Regarding the point on Library as Learning Resources: Everyone appreciated the work done by Library

- Dr. Jessy Pius said that IQAC has planned a Faculty Development Programme with IISER Pune on 28th and 29th April 2022.
- Regarding the Diploma in Product Stewardship, Dr. Manish Hate said that the Department of Chemistry had a session by Dr. Wakankar on Product stewardship which was well appreciated by all chemistry faculty members. 3.1: Degree programmes of distance learning: Dr. Sujata initiated the discussion which resulted in the following queries-

• Whether College can run regular BA and its ODL parallely, if yes whether offline admission will get affected or can launch a new program (eg. BA in Sociology, MA in Sanskrit, Hindi...) or we can go for PG diploma (eg. in Pali, Gender studies, Tribal study etc.), also Challenges in developing the e-content for the course, Teachers workload etc.

Mr. Nimkar suggested that in online mode, we should aim for pan India as well as global audience, as underdeveloped nations do not have resources, we can reach out to them. Decide programs based on 2 things - what we can teach and what the world needs. Some faculty members should do a survey and shortlist 10 programs taught in top Universities globally and should make a report on how they conduct it.

- Dr Lokur agreed and said that we can put in perspective a plan about training faculty in Digital Pedagogy for content making and delivery. We can start with a few courses in which we are comfortable. We already have passed PG Diploma in Tourism and Travel management and we will float it from 2022-23.
- Student Representatives suggested we can collaborate with Tech companies/ IGNOU for such courses.

3.2: 4-year Degree programmes

- Ms. Varsha Malwade and Dr. Vaibhavi gave a lot of suggestions regarding including different types of courses under the 4 year degree program. This is something Colleges can start provided we get proper guidelines from the University.
- Dr. Jaison said that this is a good program for students aspiring to go abroad for higher studies

3.3. Programmes of Foreign Universities that we can run in our institute

• Ms. Varsha Malwade suggested applying for GIAN programmes. Dr. Lokur said we submitted 3 proposals but did not get it. Can try for Certificate Courses with foreign universities with whom we have MoUs.

3.4: Academic Bank of Credits

- Registration for only universities has started. Whenever it starts for Autonomous Colleges we will register. However, we have to keep some courses ready for this.
- Mr. Nimkar had a basic question in this regard whether the teaching is going to be offline or online. If online it's going to be live online sessions or self-paced program.Dr. Sujata said that we have to wait for the guidelines.

3.5: Multiple entry and multiple exits during a course

- For Multiple entry and multiple exits during a course also first ABC registration is needed.
- Ms. Varsha Malwade said that BA Economics syllabus is framed in such a way that even if students exit after second year they will have some basic knowledge and can go in different areas. A lot of discussion happened in this regard.

• College will be conducting 2 brainstorming sessions on NEP implementation and IQAC will prepare a road Map/ guideline about all points discussed above
